From cow to ice cream

Summer is all about ice cream and ice cream is all about milk. And milk is...actually, who is behind milk? Do you already have a guess who we're talking about? That's right! It's the COW! The cow is the first and the most important PRODUCER of milk. Curious how it all works? Come with us on a journey of milk from the field to the store.





In order to make milk, cows need to be given the right food. For this, they get fresh grass in a pasture or meadow, or eat hay. That's a lovely treat for them.



Hay is grass that is cut in spring and summer and then dried in the sun so that it can be stored. The cows get this food when it's cold outside and nothing is growing in the fields.



To produce the hay and bring it to the farm, you need tractors. They use special machines to cut the grass and turn it over in the field a few times, so that it dries well in the sun and becomes hay.





Then the hay is collected from the field, and pressed together into large, round bales. The bales are then brought to the farm on a trailer.

Before the cows get the hay, it is cut into small pieces and softened with special machines attached to tractors. The cows love it. When they eat, they convert the nutrients in the hay into milk.

The cows live in a stall, which is cleaned every day. The tiled walls are washed with hot water and scrubbed daily. The cows are also milked daily. This can be done by hand or using an electric milking machine. They need to be clean and healthy. A veterinarian checks up on them regularly.

The fresh cow's milkis put into special containers called tankers and taken to a dairy. There it is carefully checked for bacteria which might cause illness.







and needs to be processed immediately. Some of it is put into bottles and drinking cartons. The finished dairy products are then delivered to shops. The milk is used to make yoghurt, cheese, powdered milk, kefir, cream, butter, buttermilk and children's favourite food – ICE CREAM!


